# Franklin Rural Electric Cooperative Scholarship Program

### **Rules and Instructions**

- 1. Up to three \$500 scholarships will be given annually to students who show commitment to community by volunteering in organizations or events in the community, church, etc.
- 2. The recipient shall be a graduating high school senior in the application school year (August 2023 May 2024). There will be no discrimination on the basis of age, sex, race, national origin, creed, religion, marital status, or disability.
- 3. The recipient shall be enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited college, university, or vocational/technical school within 12 months.
- 4. The recipient shall be a U.S. citizen or resident alien living in a home *currently served by Franklin REC* (i.e., if a minor, his/her parents/guardians must be members).
- 5. Those individuals not eligible for scholarships are children and grandchildren of directors and/or employees of Franklin REC.
- 6. Applications must be received on or before <u>Monday, March 4, 2024</u>. Scholarship winners will be contacted and must attend the Franklin REC annual meeting tentatively TBD April 2024 at the Franklin County Convention Center, Hampton, Iowa, to receive the scholarship.
- 7. Scholarship checks will be made payable to the student in the second semester of college after enrollment documentation is provided. Checks must be used for educational costs.
- 8. The personal letter is extremely important to the Scholarship Committee and MUST accompany the application form. Please be sure to include your educational goals, work and personal experiences, extra curricular activities, community involvement experiences, scholastic awards, and any special circumstances surrounding the application that you feel we need to consider. We also require a short statement on why cooperatives are important.
- 9. Three people must complete separate copies of the "Character Evaluation and Recommendation Form". These references cannot be relatives. At least one of the references must be the high school superintendent, principal, guidance counselor, high school teacher or advisor. One must be from a person in the community (i.e. minister, employer, neighbor, etc.) that you have worked with on community project(s). The other one is at your discretion.
- 10. Three scholarship winners will be chosen from the qualified applications received.

The application, three references, and personal letter must be received no later than Monday, March 4, 2024.
